Life Story of Reynardine...

1999

For some unknown length of time, Garret, Aideen, Stephen, and Kevin had been 'getting together' to play a few tunes and sing a few songs. It is impossible now to understand why they decided to transform the wonderfully bohemian, no-strings lifestyle of the sessioneer into the convention-bound habits of a B-A-N-D, but they did do it, and that transformation happened sometime in the fourth quarter of the last year of the second millennium.

The earliest incarnations of the group never referred to themselves as such, and hid their shocking new form under a blanket they referred to as "The Night". "The Nights" were a clever way to facilitate groupish activity without having to acknowledge the group's existence. The collected works of an established and well-loved musician were hijacked in order to serve as a vehicle for the band's own performances. "The Nights" were, on the surface, straightforward tributes to such great figures – 'The Leonard Cohen Night', 'The Bob Dylan Night', 'The Acker Bilk Night' (never completed) – but they in fact allowed the group to grow in strength without attracting the criticism newly formed groups and bands indubitably deserve. This strategy meant that by the time the group finally went overground, early in the year 2000, and started writing set-lists and trying to get gigs (habits it refuses to surrender even at the time of writing), society at large made no real attempts to limit its behaviour. Most people did not even notice.
